

Mastrly is the whole application in a single file, `index.html`. This guide covers one thing: getting that file live on your own website. Once it loads in a browser, hosting is done — signing in and your licence key are covered in the email this came with.

index.html

The whole application in one file. This is what you put on your website.

Web hosting access

Your host's File Manager or FTP details — whatever you use to add files to your site.

A few minutes

Uploading one file. There's nothing to install, configure, or keep running.

Putting Mastrly on your website

1

Upload index.html to your hosting

Using your host's File Manager or FTP, put it in a new folder on your site — for example a folder called `app`. Upload the file exactly as-is; don't rename or edit it.

2

Open the folder's address in a browser

Because the file is named `index.html`, the folder loads it directly — e.g. `https://yourdomain.com/app/`.

3

Confirm it loads

You should see the Mastrly start screen. That's it — hosting is done. From here, follow the email this guide came with to sign in and enter your licence key.

Good to know

- **HTTPS only.** The page must be served over `https` — the address must start with `https://`.
- **Use your registered address.** Mastrly is set up for one exact web address. The `www.` and non-`www.` versions count as different — load it from the one registered for your studio.
- **It's just one file.** Nothing to install or keep running; keep a copy of `index.html` as your backup.

If it doesn't load

- Check you opened the folder over `https://`, and that the file is named exactly `index.html`.
- Make sure it finished uploading — a partial upload shows a blank page.
